## Family Watch: Get Small for NanoDays at the Sciencenter

ITHACA — The small becomes large Saturday at the Sciencenter with an exploration into the miniature world of the nanoscale.

Children and their families can explore science and technology at the smallest scale during NanoDay, with more than 30 hands-on activities, family-friendly presentations and exhibitions from noon until 4 p.m. Highlights include a bilingual reading of “Horton Hears a Who!” at noon. The reading for toddlers and preschoolers will be followed by an activity utilizing the sense of smell to detect tiny things.

Stick around for a demonstration of liquid armor at 3 p.m. when Sciencenter educators will help demonstrate the nanotechnology used to make protective fabrics. The demonstration will show off a goo that flows like a liquid then acts like a solid when force is applied, in creating reinforced, flexible fabrics, according to the Sciencenter.
