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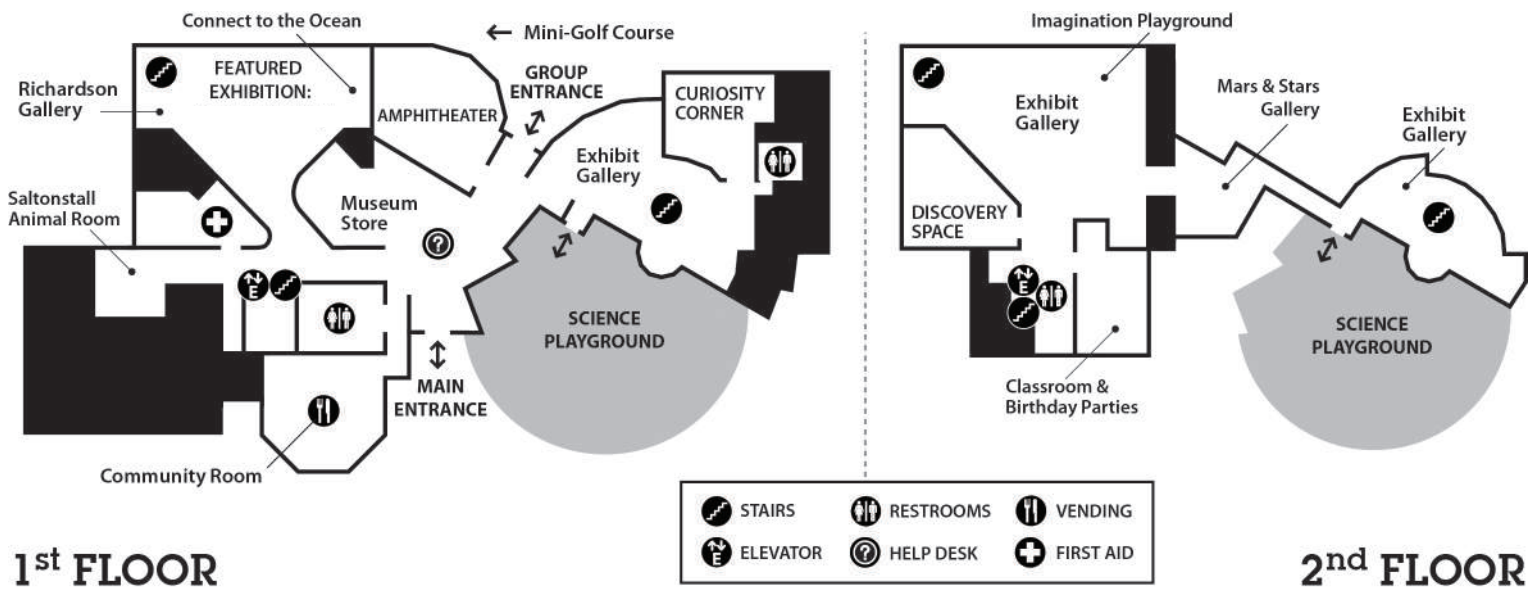

The Sciencenter has a map of the exhibits on the first and second floors, inside and outside. There is a lot to explore!





If I need help, I can ask my adult or the Sciencenter staff. The staff are there to help people and explain the exhibits.



The Sciencenter can get crowded. If there is a line to see an exhibit, or if many kids are trying to play at an exhibit, it is okay to move to another exhibit.

Kids can return to play at the exhibit later in the visit, or if they come back to the Sciencenter another day.
