



FUTURE SCIENCE LEADERS COUNSELORS-IN-TRAINING PLUS PROGRAM OVERVIEW AND APPLICATION

Future Science Leaders (FSL) Counselors-in-Training (CIT)+ is a summer program for students entering 7th-9th grade (in the fall of 2017) to explore science and develop leadership and communication skills. They do this by working on educational programming, digital media, exhibit development, and scientific research projects.

This summer participants will...

- be a CIT at the Sciencenter's Summer Camp
- deliver hands-on activities to campers and museum guests
- create printed and video newsletters
- participate and lead a citizen science project
- design, build, and test mini golf holes
- earn volunteer hours

FSL CIT+ participants must commit to an entire two-week session.

Session dates:

Session A: June 26th - July 7th

Session B: July 10th- July 21st

Session C: July 24th - August 4th

Session D: August 7th - August 18th

Session E: August 21st- September 1st

Summer program hours for FSL participants are from **8:00am to 3:30pm**.

Sciencenter membership is not required to apply, but you must commit to having a current membership by June 1st that expires after September 30th if accepted.

Cost: **Early Bird Applicants** (application received before 3/10/17): \$350*

Regular Applicants (application received after 3/10/17): \$400*

WHAT'S NEXT?

1. Early bird applications will be accepted and reviewed through **March 10th** and applicants will be notified of acceptance by **March 14th**.
Applications received after **March 10th** will be accepted and reviewed on a rolling basis through **June 21st** and applicants will be notified of acceptance within a week of receiving the application.

Applications will be judged based on availability, interests, experience, and skills.
2. You will receive an email informing you whether you have been accepted and for which session.
3. Once you have accepted your placement into the FSL CIT+ program, you will finalize your registration online where your payment will be made. This final step to registration guarantees your spot in the program. You will not be able to complete this step if you do not have a current Sciencenter membership.

Whether or not you're accepted to the summer program, you can join the FSL yearlong program in the fall to work on more educational programming, digital media, exhibit development, and scientific research projects!
